

Using his class project as the foundation, Benjamin co-founded Precision Ecology, a startup that uses drone technology with state-of-the-art sensors to collect survey-grade aerial data and create digital surface and terrain maps. Since then, Benjamin's company has been working with the Federal Highway Association to identify landslide risks caused by Hurricane Maria in El Yunque National Rainforest, Puerto Rico.

CERTIFICATE IN SECURITY MANAGEMENT

Designed to prepare administrators to meet the operational challenges of protecting people and property within a changing landscape of human and natural threats, students may complete a stand-alone Certificate in Security Management for 12 graduate credits in a single summer. Certificate credits can also be transferred into the full MAIA program.

CERTIFICATE IN GEOSPATIAL TECHNOLOGY

Designed to benefit students who seek to enhance their skills in Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and satellite remote sensing. The Certificate requires 15 graduate credits, or students may complete the Concentration in Geospatial Technology as part of the MAIA program.
